



## Letterkenny Army Depot to get a child care center

GREENE TOWNSHIP -- The Army has authorized \$4.8 million to purchase and install a Child Development Center at Letterkenny Army Depot.

The center on Georgia Avenue will have a capacity of 144 children. It will offer a safe and healthy environment for the children of active duty personnel and Letterkenny employees, according Letterkenny spokeswoman Sgt. Lisa Levack.

The center will include a fenced outdoor play area with shade structures. The building will have a reception/entrance area, administrative offices, staff lounge and work room, a full commercial kitchen, laundry room, child activity rooms, car seat and stroller storage area, janitor closet, general storage and supply room. Children's rest rooms and diapering stations will be separate from public and staff rest rooms.

The National Defense Authorization Act funds the project.

The work force at Letterkenny is getting younger and includes more active duty military personnel.

Child Development Centers are a top quality-of-life issue essential to readiness, morale and retention of the work force, Levack said.
