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CHAMBERSBURG-WAYNESBORO MSA AUGUST UNEMPLOYMENT RATE 8.9%

Note: The data contained in this news release reflects the effects of COVID-19 and evolving mitigation efforts to contain it.

HARRISBURG (SEPTEMBER 29) – The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for the Chambersburg-Waynesboro Metropolitan Statistical Area (MSA) was 8.9 percent in August, down 2.0 percentage points from July. The statewide unemployment rate was 10.3 percent, down 2.2 percentage points over the month and the national rate fell 1.8 points from July to 8.4 percent.

Seasonally adjusted total nonfarm jobs in the Chambersburg-Waynesboro MSA was essentially unchanged over the month at 59,300 in August. Over the year, jobs were down 4.8 percent (-3,000) in the MSA, while statewide jobs declined 8.2 percent.

August's Not Seasonally Adjusted Nonfarm Jobs Detail (see Table 2)

All the published supersectors were unchanged over the month in the MSA except government (+400). Local government in the MSA was up 200 from July as public schools prepared to reopen.

¹ Estimate of workers by place of residence. These data are controlled to state Current Population Survey (CPS) data which adjusts for commuting and dual job-holding. Workers are counted where they live only once regardless of the number of jobs they may hold. All in-depth inquiries relative to the estimating methodology should be addressed to the Bureau of Labor Statistics, U.S. Department of Labor. All data are subject to revision during annual benchmarking.

^{2/} Includes wage and salary workers (including agriculture), self-employed persons, and unpaid family workers (including agriculture), domestic workers, and persons involved in labor-management disputes.

^{3/} Unemployed as percent of civilian labor force, computed using unrounded data.
