CHAMBERSBURG-WAYNESBORO MSA JULY UNEMPLOYMENT RATE 12.3%

Note: The data contained in this news release reflects the effects of COVID-19 and evolving mitigation efforts to contain it.

HARRISBURG (SEPTEMBER 1) – The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for the Chambersburg-Waynesboro Metropolitan Statistical Area (MSA) was 12.3 percent in July, up 0.7 percentage points from June. The statewide unemployment rate was 13.7 percent, up 0.5 percentage points over the month and the national rate fell 0.9 points from June to 10.2 percent.

Seasonally adjusted total nonfarm jobs in the Chambersburg-Waynesboro MSA increased 3.3 percent over the month (+1,900) to 59,000 in July. Over the year, jobs were down 4.8 percent (-3,000) in the MSA, while statewide jobs declined 8.9 percent.

July's Not Seasonally Adjusted Nonfarm Jobs Detail (see Table 2)

Private service providing industries added jobs over the month in the MSA, while goods producing industries were essentially unchanged. Government in the local MSA decreased from June due to public schools ending their academic year.

^{1/} Estimate of workers by place of residence. These data are controlled to state Current Population Survey (CPS) data which adjusts for commuting and dual job-holding. Workers are counted where they live only once regardless of the number of jobs they may hold. All in-depth inquiries relative to the estimating methodology should be addressed to the Bureau of Labor Statistics, U.S. Department of Labor. All data are subject to revision during annual benchmarking.

^{2/} Includes wage and salary workers (including agriculture), self-employed persons, and unpaid family workers (including agriculture), domestic workers, and persons involved in labor-management disputes.

^{3/} Unemployed as percent of civilian labor force, computed using unrounded data.
