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CHAMBERSBURG-WAYNESBORO MSA UNEMPLOYMENT RATE AT 3.3% IN MAY

HARRISBURG (JUNE 27) – The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for the Chambersburg-Waynesboro Metropolitan Statistical Area (MSA) was down one-tenth of a percentage point over the month to 3.3 percent in May. The state unemployment rate declined by one-tenth of a point to 4.0 percent in May, while the national rate rose three-tenths of a point to 3.7 percent. Over the year, the local MSA's rate declined by four-tenths of a percentage point.

Seasonally adjusted total nonfarm jobs in the Chambersburg-Waynesboro MSA were up 400 over the month to 62,800 in May. Over the year, jobs were up 2.3 percent (+1,400) in the MSA, while statewide jobs increased 2.5 percent.

May Not Seasonally Adjusted Nonfarm Jobs Detail

Job levels in all seven published supersectors were mostly improved over the month. Over the year, jobs increased in six of the seven with the largest movement in trade, transportation & utilities (+500).

FOOTNOTES

- 1) Estimate of workers by place of residence. These data are controlled to state Current Population Survey (CPS) data which adjusts for commuting and dual job-holding. Workers are counted where they live only once regardless of the number of jobs they may hold. All in-depth inquiries relative to the estimating methodology should be addressed to the Bureau of Labor Statistics, U.S. Department of Labor. All data are subject to revision during annual benchmarking.
- 2) Includes wage and salary workers (including agriculture), self-employed persons, and unpaid family workers (including agriculture), domestic workers, and persons involved in labor-management disputes.
- 3) Unemployed as percent of civilian labor force, computed using unrounded data.
- 4) Seasonally adjusted MSA level data (and their equivalent) is developed by the federal Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS); seasonal adjustment for all other sub-state areas are developed by CWIA.
